



Dabrrro Homes wins national award for home design excellence

Lake Louise AB – February 22, 2006 — Dabrrro Homes of Edmonton, Alberta has won the 2006 Award for Design Excellence honourable mention presented by the Cement Association of Canada. The Design Excellence award is given to a residential project that makes extensive use of concrete construction, while demonstrating outstanding design and functionality.

The award is one of five presented at a special Cement Association of Canada Housing Awards pre-conference luncheon ceremony at the 63rd National Conference hosted by the Canadian Home Builders' Association in Lake Louise, Alberta. Recipients of the 2006 Award for Design Excellence were selected by a panel of independent judges from Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) and Natural Resources Canada (NRCan).

Not only beautiful but energy efficient too, the Dabrrro Homes colonial-style 1,800 sq. ft. dwelling was built with a system known for its superior energy efficiency – Insulating Concrete Forms (ICF). These hollow foam blocks or panels are connected with plastic ties and filled with reinforced concrete. The left-in-place forms provide a continuous insulation and sound barrier, as well as a backing for drywall on the inside and stucco, lap siding, or brick on the outside. ICF homes generate less construction waste, are quiet and comfortable to live in and require less maintenance

“Dabrrro Homes has demonstrated discerning innovation and foresight,” explains Cement Association of Canada President François Lacroix. “Armed with the knowledge that escalating fuel prices will be hammering homeowners, this builder recognizes the important role that concrete can play in minimizing residential energy costs. They have provided hard evidence that insulating concrete forms are the best home building solution for marrying energy efficiency with superb aesthetic appeal.”
